

Dear Valued Client,

It has come to our attention that Insurers across the board are taking a stricter stance regarding Foreign Drivers with reference to the following:

- Medical certificates – “The driver must have a medical certificate issued by a medical practitioner licensed to practice medicine within South Africa and must be renewed every twelve (12) months.”
- A valid work permit issued by authorities must be in place.
- In addition, a valid foreign driver’s license must be accompanied by a valid defensive driving certificate (Equivalent to a South African PrDP) issued in the same country as the driver’s license itself.
- If a person obtains permanent residency or returns to SA with a foreign licence, he has one year to change the foreign licence for a SA licence, after which his foreign licence may not be used on the road anymore.
- All South African residence/drivers must be in possession of a valid South African driver’s licence accompanied by a valid PrDP when conveying goods:
- Also take note that it’s advisable to apply for a new PrDP 6-8 weeks prior to expiry of the existing.
